# 6 Ways to Save Money on Cas

The average price of gasoline in Orange County reached record highs last month, according to data from the American Automobile Association. As of March 11, prices here hit nearly \$6 per gallon (vs. \$3.90 per gallon a year prior).

It's not yet known when prices will begin to dip back down. In the meantime, here are some tips to reduce sticker shock at the pumps.

**1. Cet the lowest gas prices nearby**. You don't need to burn fuel driving around looking for the cheapest prices. Apps such as **gasbuddy.com** list costs-per-gallon at stations near you.

2. Ride a bus or train instead of driving. Transit is already typically a bargain over driving, and—unlike driving the cost of riding transit doesn't go up when gas prices do. For a limited time, you can save even more with the

**OC Bus Value Pass.** Available through July 15, the Value Pass offers a 40% discount over regular fares. Riders can save up to \$10 on a five-pack of 1-day passes and up to \$29 on a 30-day pass.



If you ride **Riverside Transit Agency** buses, including CommuterLink, it's only 25 cents to ride through April.

**3. Drive less**. Carpool with just one other person on your daily commute and you'll cut gas prices in half. Even carpooling as little as once a week can add up in cost savings—especially when gas prices are on the rise.

can help! Or visit **ridematch.info** to get a of list of people who live and work near you who might want to share the ride.

4. Whenever you can, walk or bike instead of driving. Commuting by bike can be an option even if you live far from the office—just ride to your nearby transit stop and bring your bike along.

5. Drive smart. A few tips for better fuel efficiency:

Slow down and drive the speed limit. Avoid accelerating quickly. Combine errands so you'll drive fewer miles and travel more often on a warmed-up (and therefore more efficient) engine.

6. Co electric. If you're in the market for a new car, consider making the gas-saving switch to an electric or hybrid vehicle. As an added savings, you may qualify for a rebate of up to \$7,000 through the California Clean Vehicle Rebate Project as well as a \$100 rebate\* available to County of Orange and

Superior Court employees.

\*The Orange County \$100 EV/hybrid vehicle rebate only applies to a lease or purchase of cars and trucks (not electric bikes).

OCTA is the first large transit agency in the region to offer **free bus rides to all youth ages 6 to 18** on an ongoing basis.

The Youth Ride Free pass—available by request from parents—is a physical pass with a magnetic stripe. OCTA will continue working to distribute the passes in partnership with local K-12 school districts, as well as at the OCTA store and online.
