5 Fast Facts About the New 405 Express Lanes

The 405 Express Lanes have already logged more than 2 million user trips since they opened December of last year.

That level of usage is about the same as that of the 91 Express Lanes, which Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) has owned and operated for more than 20 years.

Did You Know...?

- The 405 Express Lanes cover 14 miles of I-405 between the SR-73 freeway in Costa Mesa and I-605 near the L.A. County line—one of the busiest stretches of freeway in the nation.
- 2. They carry about twice as much carpool traffic as nearby freeways due to a policy of allowing 3+ person carpools to travel for free. Roughly one in four of the vehicles using the toll lanes are carpools.

- 3. A FasTrak transponder with a valid account to pay tolls is required to use the lanes—even if traveling free as a carpool. As of February, 6,800 transponders had been issued to allow access to the lanes.
- **4.** The heaviest traveled days are Fridays; the least traveled days are Sundays.
- 5. Most travel is between I-605 and SR 22.

A Great Way to Stop Smog...

Ridesharing instead of driving alone is a good way to do your share for clean air. A car causes .96 pounds of CO2 per mile to be spewed into the air—so driving alone means you're responsible for nearly a pound of pollutants for every mile you drive.

Transit on average is roughly half that, at .45 pounds/mile per person.

Vanpooling is only .22—so almost five people can travel for the carbon footprint of one.

Of course, bicycling and walking are a zero-emission way to go.

Getting people out of their solo commutes plays an important role in California's clean air efforts, since 37% of the state's total emissions come from vehicles.



OCTA Free Wilderness Hikes

OCTA oversees more than 1,300 acres of protected wilderness. To encourage people to appreciate the environment, they hold a series of guided wilderness hikes through these areas that are otherwise not open to the public.

Upcoming hikes are March 16 at Wren's View Preserve and June 1 at Pacific Horizon Preserve.

Are You Paying Too Much Income Tax?

A tax season reminder from the Rideshare Office: If you vanpool or ride the bus/Metrolink to work and you aren't signed up for the Commuter Choice program, you could be paying more income tax than you need to.

Commuter Choice allows you to purchase your fares through a convenient monthly payroll deduction using pre-tax dollars. By doing

so, you can reduce your taxable income—up to the IRS limit of \$315 each month.

Get in Gear for Bike Month

The Rideshare Office Can Help You Get Into Vanpooling

A vanpool is five or more people who commute together regularly in a leased van, splitting expenses. It's a bargain, low-stress way to commute. But is it for you? It could be if you live 15+ miles from work and have fairly consistent work hours.

There are plenty of good reasons to vanpool, and the Rideshare Office can help you get started.

To find if there's an open seat on a vanpool, log into **ridematch.info**. Enter information about your commute such as where you live and work and your schedule. You'll get an instant list of any vanpools on your route.

If there's no vanpool serving your commute, why not start one of your own?

Starting One Is as Easy as 1-2-3

- 1) Find other riders at your worksite. Call the OC Rideshare office at 714.834.7600. They'll prepare a RideGuide for you to help locate riders who live near you with similar schedules. They can also set up a "meet and greet" of your potential vanpool riders to get it off the ground.
- 2) Decide on your route and common pick-up location for riders.
- 3) Contact an approved vanpool leasing vendor to let them know you are ready to start a new vanpool. They'll walk you through the steps and provide any required forms.

Vanpool Perks & Subsidies

- If you start a new vanpool, you could be eligible for a \$300 start-up bonus.
- OCTA offers a \$400 monthly subsidy toward vanpool lease costs for qualifying vanpools, lowering fares on average 25%.
- Sign up to pay for vanpool fares though the Rideshare Office using pre-tax dollars to save money by reducing your overall taxable income.
- Vanpooling will allow you to join Club Rideshare, earning a \$40 bonus, plus being eligible for \$25 gift card prize drawings throughout the year.

What You Need to Know About Carpooling in Orange County...


If you've been thinking of carpooling to work—or even if you just occasionally share a ride with friends and family—here are some things you need to know:

"All regular carpool lanes in Orange County are free and open to carpools with a minimum of two occupants. No transponder is required."

- Using carpool lanes typically saves a minute per mile over driving alone.
- Carpools with three or more people can ride free or at a discount in Orange County's express toll lanes on the 91 and 405 freeways. You must have a FasTrak account and a transponder.

On the **91 Express Lanes**, carpools are required to drive through the HOV3+ Carpool Lane at each toll point to receive the carpool discount.

On the **405** Express Lanes, carpools must have a working transponder set to the number of people in the vehicle.



Yes, kids count as carpool passengers.

Join Club Rideshare, Earn \$40

If you carpool, vanpool, take the train or bus, drive an EV/PHEV, bicycle or walk to work or telework just 20 times in a 90-day period, you can join Club Rideshare.

New members can earn a \$40 signup incentive, plus are eligible for monthly drawings for a \$25 bonus (paid via payroll), special perks and more.

Each year you renew, you get a \$15 bonus.

New Day Storage Facilities for Bike Commuters

If you bike to work—or would like to give it a try—there is now a safe, convenient place to stow your bike. The County recently installed bike storage facilities that feature secure bike racks. Air compressors are available onsite for flat or deflated tires.

The facilities are located in front of the Central Administration Building North (CAN) and the Central Administration Building South (CAS) near the multipurpose rooms.

If you have trouble locating them, call the Rideshare Office or ask the lobby personnel for assistance.

• Orange County changed from double yellow lines to double white lines to indicate where you cannot cross into a carpool lane.

If you see a single solid white line, you can enter/exit the carpool lane, but only if it's safe to do so.

Stretches of carpool lane with dashed white lines are the preferred entry/exit points.

- You don't have to worry about getting stuck at work in an emergency or work unexpected overtime on a day you carpooled to work. You can be reimbursed for the cost of a taxi, rental car or Uber/Lyft (up to two times a year) through the County's Guaranteed Ride Home program.
- The Rideshare Office can help you find a carpool partner—someone who works and lives near you and has a similar schedule. You can also get a list of potential carpool partners at ridematch.info or by calling 511.



Free Summer Trolleys

Skip the drive and hop on free summer trolleys that take you to destinations around Orange County:

- The San Clemente Trolley operates daily until Sept. 30. The system is made up of two routes: a Downtown Red Line and a North San Clemente Blue Line.
- The Laguna Niguel Trolley will take riders "from the hill to the sea" all summer long, and at Stop #3 (in front of the Ritz-Carlton Resort), riders can connect with the free trolleys operated by Dana Point and Laguna Beach. The trolley runs Thursday through Sunday every 20 minutes until Sept. 2.
- The Dana Point Trolley runs daily through Sept. 5 with two loops that give riders access to coastal cities and allow them to easily transfer between other city-run trolleys.
- The Balboa Peninsula Trolley runs Saturdays and Sundays through Sept. 2, providing service around the peninsula. It also offers service on Independence Day and Labor Day.

Are You Paying Too Much to Board OC Bus?

The most recent Lunch and Learn workshop was all about the Perk

Pass, a way to save money on OC Bus fares.

In case you missed the news...

An annual Perk Pass allows you to board OC Bus at the lowest available fare. Each ride costs only \$1.25 per boarding (versus the standard \$2 fare) with a monthly cap of \$69—no matter how many bus trips you take. With a Perk Pass, there's no need to buy monthly passes or daily passes.

To use it, simply swipe your Perk Pass upon boarding. Fares are compiled monthly, and you'll pay your monthly fares automatically via payroll deduction.

The bonus: This also allows you to pay for transit fares using pre-tax dollars, reducing your overall taxable income.

Contact the Rideshare Office for more information or to sign up. They'll then mail you an annual Perk Pass and set you up for payroll deduction. You pay nothing upfront.



BRAVO! Buses Are Now OC Bus Rapid— Fewer Stops for a Faster Ride

OC Bus is changing the name of its BRAVO! limited-stop service. It's now OC Bus Rapid, and new buses and signage have been rolling out.

OC Bus Rapid makes a third of the stops of regular bus service, getting riders to their destinations faster.

New Fiscal Year, New GRH Rides


County of Orange and Superior Court employees can be reimbursed for a ride if they need to get home due to an emergency on a day they got to work by ridesharing—up to two rides per fiscal year. Emergency ride options include rental car, taxi, Uber/Lyft, transit or approved car-sharing companies.

Since a new fiscal begins on July 1, if you've claimed the maximum number of rides home this fiscal year, your total number of rides will then reset to zero.

How to Park an EV at County Worksites

Electric vehicle (EV) charging stations are located at the following lots: Manchester Lot, P7 Twin Towers lot, and the County Administration South Building parking structure. Additional EV charging stations are planned in the Civic Center area as County Budget and Energy rebate incentive programs allow.

To use the charging stations, you must set up an account with the ChargePoint vendor and pay for the electricity (per KWh) and any additional charges if they exceed the time limit while charging your EV.

Get Help with Completing the Survey

You need to submit a survey whether you commute daily, work a hybrid schedule, or telework.

The Rideshare Office offers this short, helpful video on how to complete the transportation survey. It answers the most often asked questions, including how to indicate that you work a flex schedule, work a hybrid schedule, or vary the way you commute throughout the week.

Be Sure to Say "Yes" to a RideGuide

When you fill out the annual transportation survey, you have the option to receive a free RideGuide commute planner-which you can get by checking "yes" to the last question in the survey.

A few reasons to request a RideGuide:

- It gives you commute options based on where you live, work and your work scheduleeverything from bus/rail routing to carpools to where to find a convenient Park & Ride.
- Even if you're not ready to rideshare now, it might come in handy if you find yourself in need of a way to get to work.
- Transit options change all the time. The RideGuide will give you the most up-to-date options.
 - You don't have to use it, but it'll be there if you need it.

Ride Free on California Clean Air Day

California Clean Air Day is Oct. 2.

Metrolink will offer free rides to encourage Southern Californians to leave their vehicles at home and opt for a more sustainable alternative.

Rides will also be free on OC Bus, Metro Bus and Rail and all San Bernardino County transit agencies for the day.

Visit cleanairday.org to find out more and take the Clean Air Pledge.



If you're new to riding the bus or train, you could be reimbursed up to 75% of the cost of fares when you give it a try.

This special start-up incentive for County employees reimburses a portion of fares for three months: 75% for the first month, 50% for the second month and 25% for the third.

To claim a reimbursement, you must not have commuted by train or bus in the past 90 days and not have previously claimed the startup incentive.

To get a bargain rate after the incentive, the Rideshare Office can sign you up for a Perk Pass—a swipe-card that offers the lowest available price OC Bus offers (and can be purchased using pre-tax dollars via payroll deduction).





Tips for Commuting in a Quake

Last month's series of earthquakes may have shaken up your worries about when "the big one" might hit. Many Southern Californians have a plan and stock of supplies at home to be prepared, but what do you do if an earthquake happens while you're on the road?

Here, we offer some tips to be earthquake ready if it happens.

"Do you have an alternate way home from work if your usual way is disrupted?"



Just as you should plan for an earthquake in your home, you should also make an emergency plan for your commute.

Do you have an alternate way home from work if your usual way is disrupted?

A RideGuide can be a helpful tool so that you have options on hand including potential carpool

partners and bus/rail routes. Download one now at ridematch.info or ask the Rideshare Office so you have options on hand if you need them.

2. Know What to Do If an Earthquake Hits on Your Commute

If you're driving or carpooling...

- Pull over to the side of the road, stop, and set the parking brake.
- Avoid overpasses, bridges, power lines, signs and other hazards.
- Stay inside the vehicle until the shaking stops, then proceed carefully by avoiding fallen debris, cracked or shifted payment, and emergency vehicles.
- If a power line falls on the car, stay inside until a trained person removes the wire.

If onboard a bus...

- Stay onboard unless instructed otherwise by the bus driver.
- When the shaking has stopped, the bus will stop at the first available safe area away from overpasses, tall buildings, electrical wires or other hazards.
- If evacuation from the bus is necessary, the driver will first survey outside for any unsafe conditions and direct bus passengers to a safe area.
 - Otherwise, the driver will await instructions to proceed when it is safe to do so.



If onboard Metrolink...

All Metrolink trains are equipped with ShakeAlert an early earthquake warning system. This cutting-edge technology automatically slows or stops trains in the event of an earthquake. Within seconds, ShakeAlert provides data to help operational staff evaluate the rail network and when it is safe to resume service.

Metrolink train operators are trained to keep riders informed and how to proceed if evacuation is necessary.

The survey measures "average vehicle ridership," or AVR, which is how many people on average are in each vehicle arriving at the worksite.

For the 2024 survey year, the County's AVR is 1.39 (up from 1.38 in 2023). "It's good

news that we continue to hold steady in our AVR, and even get a small bump this year," says

Get a Vanpool Subsidy of Up to \$800 a Month



Good news: OCTA now offers vanpool subsidies of up to \$800 monthly toward vanpool lease costs (up from \$400 a month).

The standard subsidy is \$600 a month. Two additional \$100 subsidies are available:

- Vanpools that seat eight or more people with an 85% occupancy rate
- Vanpools that are zeroemissions vehicles

The vanpool must be leased through a vanpool provider contracted with OCTA and maintain at least 50% ridership.

Thomas McCaughey, rideshare program consultant. "Fewer cars commuting into the office contributes to less traffic and cleaner air."

The top alternative to driving solo among employees continues to be teleworking.

Carpooling was a close second, with about 5% getting to work sharing the ride with a friend or coworker.

Flexible work schedules also helped keep cars off the road. During the survey week, nearly 14,000 round-trip commutes were eliminated thanks to days off from people working flex schedules.

IRS Cap Up \$10

For the 2025 tax year, the Internal Revenue
Service (IRS) maximum if you pay for transit and vanpool fares using pre-tax dollars gets a slight bump—from \$315 to \$325 per month.

The County allows employees to pay for fares using pre-tax dollars, thus lowering overall income and potentially saving on income tax.

Is Commuting by Transit an Option for You?

See if there's a bus route that fits your schedule at **ridematch.info**. Train schedule and fare information can be found at **metrolinktrains.com/schedules**.

If you're new to riding transit, you can give it a try at up to 75% off fares with an incentive offered through the County. It reimburses employees 75% of fare costs the first month, 50% the second and 25% the third.

Transit riders can also sign up to get lower fares through the County's **payroll deduction** program.





Ride Free on Transit Equity Day

Feb. 4 is Transit Equity Day. In honor of Rosa Parks' birthday, it's a day that promotes making transit affordable and accessible to people in all communities.

Fares will be free all day on Metrolink trains throughout Southern California. Just arrive at the station and board the train (no ticket required).



A Year in Review - 5 Big Changes You May Have Missed

From new express lanes to more rail connections and more, here are five happenings in transportation in the past year that could affect how you get to work...

405 Express Lanes opened. A year ago on Dec. 1, Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) opened the **405** Express Lanes. Running between SR-73 in Costa Mesa and I-605 at border of Los Angeles County, the lanes allow motorists to travel faster for a toll.

Vehicles with three or more people can use the lanes for free.

All vehicles—including carpools—must have a FasTrak transponder.


Metrolink added more trains and more connections. Metrolink added 32 weekday trains—a nearly 23% increase in service. With the new schedule, riders can enjoy more choices for when they travel as well as faster transfers.

The changes also impacted several connecting bus routes. On Nov. 10, OC Bus adjusted its schedule so affected bus lines are better timed to meet Metrolink trains.

County cyclists get a safe, convenient place to stow bikes. If you bike to work (or you'd like to), good news: The County last year added bike storage facilities. Now you can commute by bike without worrying what to do with it once you get to the office.

The facilities are located in front of the Central Administration Building North (CAN) and the Central Administration Building South (CAS) near the multi- purpose rooms.

They include secure bike racks, as well as air compressors for flat or deflated tires.





BRAVO! buses are now OC Bus Rapid. OC Bus changed the name of its BRAVO! limited-stop service. It's now OC Bus Rapid, and it makes a third of the stops of regular bus service—getting riders to their destinations faster.

OC Bus Rapid routes serve several County worksites. Fares are the same as other OC Bus routes. **Click here** for route information.

The opening of the Los Aliso's Boulevard bridge brings the I-5 construction closer

to completion. The bridge is part of improvements in a 6.5-mile widening project on the I-5 Freeway between SR-73 and El Toro Road.

OCTA expanded sidewalks and bike lanes on the bridge, making it more accessible for people to walk or bike.

Construction on the I-5 project began in mid-2019 and includes extending carpool lanes and converting them to continuous access. The project is expected to be completed in early 2025.
